



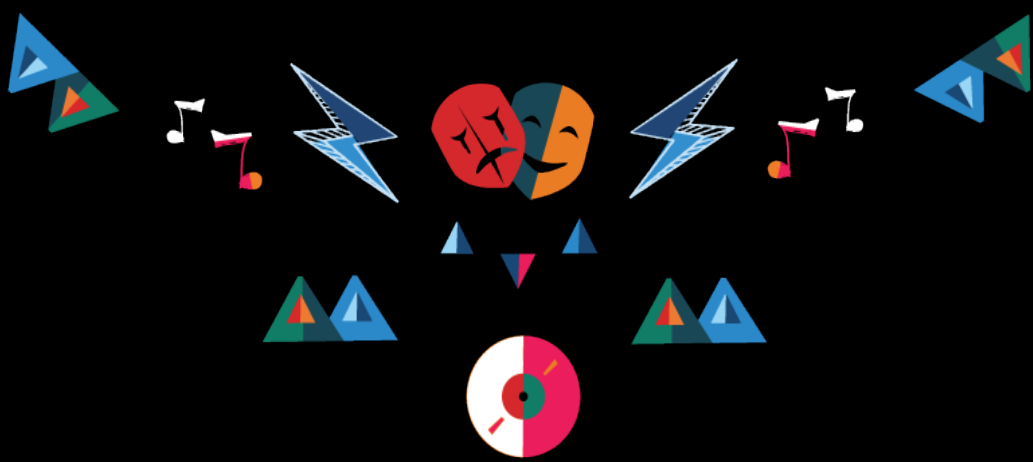

THE BREAKDOWN

Week One: Getting to Know Each Other

Week Two: A Skills Masterclass

Get an in-depth introduction to your chosen artform and work on creative projects, directed by you, that will help you gain skills and confidence.

Week Three: Inspiration & Trips

Brainstorming workshops focussing on the performance and exhibitions taking place the following week, and a trip to venues that will spark some inspiration.

Week Four: Showcase Week!

Take part in rehearsals, building up to the big day on Friday, when the groups in each area will take part in a final showcase and exhibit work produced over the past month.
